

- Bus

If you would like to use the bus, make sure you buy your ticket in advance (at one of the many

'Payshops, just look for this sign - it will be cheaper than buying it inside the bus (1.20€ / 1.85€). These tickets can be used both for the bus and the METRO.

You will find these bus lines within a walking distance from the minigolf course all of which connect with METRO stops somewhere along their routes:

500 - Matosinhos (2 min)

(In Matosinhos you will find exquisite grilled fish and a lot of good restaurants and coffee shops overlooking the sea.)

200 - City Centre (7min)

204 - City Centre (7 min)

- Metro

This is a fast and reliable means of transportation if you're looking to visit Porto and its outskirts.

The ticket is the same as for the bus and once you validate it you can travel as much as you want for one hour. But be careful to check carefully across how many zones you will be travelling and to buy the appropriate ticket (if you're travelling across two zones, you should have a Z2 ticket, if you're travelling across three zones, a Z3, and so on).

European Championship – Porto 2012

As you probably know, the European Championship in 2012 took place right here, in Porto. This championship turned out to be a great experience both for the organizing team and for the more than 100 players that came here and were a part of it. There are a lot of reasons why everyone loved it here, these are just a few:

- the minigolf course

It's a beautiful and renovated course with miniature golf and concrete lanes. Most of the players of the European Championship were quite happy with the course, its location and surroundings and they gave us great feedback.

- the location

The course is located in a municipal garden, surrounded by palm trees, and by the sea, so you can actually smell and look at the ocean while you're playing minigolf. More precisely, this area is where the river meets the ocean, hence it's name (Foz).

- the temperature and the beach just across the street

In June, you can count on an average temperature of 25°C, so when you're done playing minigolf or if you just need a break, it will only take you a minute to cross the street and get to the beach. And after a good swim and some sunbathing, you can come back to the course and enjoy some fresh air under the trees of the minigolf course.
